

At St. Aidan's, on most Sundays, we pray for individuals celebrating birthdays and anniversaries. For some, saying these prayers week after week, is too much, too much repetition. I understand this view; however, I believe that saying these prayers each week is important! The prayers remind us that life is short and each week they call us back to a place of gratitude - for our lives, for the lives of others, and for relationships. Each Sunday and each day during the month of November we are called to notice God's blessings in our midst.

On **All Saints Sunday, November 3**, we celebrate the lives of the people we see no longer, the official and the unofficial saints, the people whom we never actually knew, those we may have barely known, and the people who made an indelible mark on our lives. This is a special day in the life of the church but also has personal significance. The unique feature of our worship service on All Saints Day is the affirmation of baptismal vows. Together, we will express our gratitude to God for loving us, and we will affirm our promise to live in relationship with one another. Saying these vows together helps us notice God's blessings, consider the future, and it should motivate us to actively engage in our common life by prayerfully voting on November 5.

During November, our young people will gather for Confirmation classes, and they will attend a weekend youth "lock-in" at Pine Lake Camp. These are important faith formation experiences! I ask that everyone in the congregation support these young people with encouragement and prayers.

On Sunday, November 3 and Sunday, November 17, Deacon REGS Scheeler and his wife Pat will present an "End of Life" Workshop. Throughout our experience of this workshop, we are all invited to notice the many blessings in our lives and carefully consider all those who will inherit the world from us.

Near the end of the month, we offer public gratitude with our ecumenical friends on Thanksgiving Eve, as we worship together at First United Methodist Church. Most of us will conclude the month with family, friends, and food at our own Thanksgiving Day celebrations. I pray that we appreciate the special quality of this month and rest in a place of gratitude for our own lives, for the lives of others, for our relationships, and for the gift of God's abiding love.

### From Donna's Desk

October is the anniversary of our welcoming Mother Esther to St. Aidan's -

YES - that was four years ago! We need to take this time to reflect and applaud the many ways we offer a place of worship and community for everyone. Mother Esther has worked with the vestry and ministry support from Pastora Loretta and Deacon Terry to provide a variety of worship services, formation opportunities, pastoral care, and ongoing administration of the parish and staff. She was hired, during Covid, as a part-time Priest-in-charge. Since 2022 her time increased to 75% and in July 2023 Mother Esther was installed as Rector of St. Aidan's by Bishop Lee. The vestry and faith community of St. Aidan's has come to expect many things worship service every Sunday, an online presence through recorded services, Facebook and web site, a beautiful, well-kept building, formation, and community life within the parish and with the broader community, to name a few. See upcoming opportunities on page 4 that exemplify how we continue to build that community and stay connected.

As we approach the end of the year, it is time to elect a new **Senior Warden** to the vestry. The by-laws state: At each Annual Meeting, a Senior Warden and Junior Warden are elected for a term of one year and may be reelected twice, for a total of three years. The Senior Warden is the lay president of the parish. When the parish is without a Rector, the Senior Warden has the responsibility to maintain the worship, preside at Vestry meetings, maintain mission records, and care for the welfare of the parish, while supervising a search for a new Rector. It has not been an arduous task to be your Senior Warden as St. Aidan's has many helping hands. Consider how you can support St. Aidan's as Senior Warden. I welcome your interest in this role.

Thank you to Mother Esther, the ministry team of Pastora Loretta and Deacon Terry; the vestry, our treasurer, sexton, formation teachers, readers, acolytes, ECW, gardeners, musicians, choir, Good Samaritans, technology support/programs, worship attendance onsite/online, communications through the ENews and Stag & Staff, and your financial giving. Incredible work is being done to fulfill our mission. If you are working on something that you really care about, you don't have to be pushed.


